- a) As used in this code section, the term:
- (1) "Law enforcement officer" means a sheriff, deputy sheriff, police officer, policeman, peace officer, officer or member of the department of Public Safety, or other officer or official who has the power of arrest and who is responsible for enforcing the criminal laws of the federal government or the state or its political subdivision.
 - (2) "Local government" means any county or municipality of this state.
 - (3) "Personally identifiable information" means the residential address or phone number of an individual and the individual's spouse, if applicable.
- b) Within 30 days after receiving a written request by any law enforcement officer, a local government shall remove the personally identifiable information of such law enforcement officer from all property records that are publicly available on any internet website of the local government.

I understand that by making this request:

- I affirm that I am the legal and rightful owner of the property referenced on this application.
- I must submit a valid form of ID and a state or federal issued employment ID or credentials with this application.
- The information to be removed will be the information contained solely on the Henry County Tax Assessors' website.
- The property information to be removed from the Henry County Tax Assessors' website will be for the property information referenced in this request.
- A separate application must be submitted for each property I wish to have removed from the Henry County Tax Assessors' website.
- By voluntarily removing this information from the Henry County Tax Assessors' website the information will be unavailable for viewing by me as well as the general public, including but not limited to those I may contract or have contracted to do business with, such as contractors, real estate agents, real estate appraisers, closing attorneys or any other business entity, and any such person, persons or entity will only be able to access the record through an official open record request along with a valid ID.
- The removal of my property information from the Henry County Tax Assessors' website may slow the retrieval of information needed by federal or state agencies in the event of an emergency.
- The removal of this information does not discharge the Tax Assessor of their duties or responsibilities, which at times, may require a physical onsite visit to the property by a staff appraiser.
- Once my information is removed, I may only retrieve the information by filing a written request along with a valid ID.
- In the event I want my property information reinstated on the Henry County Tax Assessors' website, I will need to submit a written request along with supply a valid ID.
- The Henry County Board of Tax Assessors does not have oversight of information displayed on the Henry County Tax Commissioner's website, any website maintained by the Henry County Governing Authority or any third-party website.
- As an applicant I am required to submit for consideration all information outlined in this application. If I fail to do so, I understand that my application may be delayed and or be subject to denial until such time that the proper, verifiable information is supplied to the Henry County Board of Tax Assessors for consideration.

I understand that the property information contained in the Henry County Tax Assessors' records can be released to any requestor through an official open record request, except that information that is specifically exempted from disclosure. O.C.G.A § 50-18-71(a.) & O.C.G.A § 50-18-72(21).

O.C.G.A § 16-10-23 A person who falsely holds himself or herself out as a peace officer, officer of the court, or other public officer or employee with intent to mislead another into believing that he or she is actually such officer commits the offense of impersonating an officer and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$1,000.00 or by imprisonment for not less than one nor more than five years, or both.

I understand and release the Henry County Board of Assessors' and their staff from any liability from dissemination of this information on their public website or otherwise. I hereby understand and agree with the terms set forth in this application and under penalty of law, I swear that the information provided on this application is true.
